The Dinner Station is offering youngsters and their parents a different summer activity this year. At Conductor Camp, families work together to make chicken pot pies and dirt cakes, and will be able to take their meals home for dinner along with a T-shirt, conductor hat and train whistle.

Children ages 5 and older will learn measuring, table setting, table etiquette and how to follow recipes. Cost is \$30. Parents can attend with up to two children.

Older children, ages 12 and older, can participate in the Junior Chef program, where they can help parents prepare dinner for the month. They also prepare and take home a free dirt cake.
